

# The Post Radio Time Table

**9:15 a. m., WJSV**—"Wellsprings of Music" titles the regular Tuesday morning sessions of the American School of the Air, this being the first of the series. Divided into two groups of 13 programs each, one dealing with the folk-music of the Americas and presenting for the second season Alan Lomax, assistant in charge of the Archives of American Folk-Music in the Library of Congress. The alternate Tuesdays will be devoted to symphonic music under the direction of composer-conductor Philip James.

**6:15 p. m., WJSV**—President Robert M. Hutchins of the University of Chicago inaugurates the fiftieth anniversary celebrations of the great university.

**7:15, WOL**—The Willkie Washington Committee commences a new series. "A Democrat for Willkie." Haven B. Page, local attorney, is the first speaker on this program which, while nearly completed, welcomes other Democrats for Willkie at its Fifteenth street headquarters.

**8, WMAL**—Audience participation programs continue with Ben Bernie's "Give a Guy a Hand" notion. Someone with a particularly pertinent problem is chosen from the audience. He presents his problem to someone of the opposite sex, also chosen from the audience.

**10:15, WJSV**—College students learn how they are affected by the compulsory military service program when Chancellor Harry Woodburn Chase of New York University and President C. C. Williams of Lehigh University discuss the college men's problems with Lieut. Col. Lewis B. Hershey, executive officer at National Selective Service Headquarters and Dr. Frederick Osborn, chairman of the Advisory Committee on Selective Service.
