

Musical highlights of an event-studded Golden Jubilee season for the Chicago Symphony orchestra will be broadcast starting tonight at 9:30 over WGN and continuing weekly until April 17. Dr. Frederick Stock will conduct the first concert, highlighting his new composition, which "includes everything but the cash register." Other numbers on the program include Symphony No. 3 by Beethoven, "Till Eulenspiegel's Merry Pranks" by Strauss, and "Capriccio Espagnol" by Rimsky-Korsakov.
