

# FDR, Knox, and Leahy Discuss Hemisphere Events, Naval Defense

John P. Butler, president of the Neighborhood house board, will speak on WIBA at 6:15 tonight in the interests of the Madison Community Union appeal for funds to support 16 social agencies. Neighborhood house is a fund-supported agency.

America's interests in international affairs will receive the attention of seven speakers in three broadcasts tonight.

President Roosevelt will discuss "Hemispheric Events" in an address to be broadcast at 8 by the three major networks by short wave to Latin America. Among the stations in this area carrying the message from Dayton, Ohio, will be WIBA, WGN, WBBM, and WMAQ.

Secretary of the Navy Frank Knox and Admiral William D. Leahy, governor of Puerto Rico, will discuss important phases of the nation's new naval program in a joint broadcast at 9:15 over WBBM.

Four newspapermen, experts on foreign affairs, will talk over the possible American effects of Japan's partnership in the Berlin-Rome axis during the People's Platform on WBBM at 6. They will be Eugene Lyons, editor of the American Mercury; Robert Aura Smith, of the New York Times; Richard O. Boyer, of PM, and Cornelius V. Starr, publisher of the Shanghai Evening Post and Mercury.
