## WHA to Open Political Forum Monday at 10:45

With free radio time for the discussion of politics WHA will open its 1940 political education forum Monday with broadcasts at 10:45 and 1:15 p. m. The same time periods will be used on following days. The forum will run until the Saturday before election.

The purpose of the forum is to give listeners an opportunity to hear all sides of the campaign for the state-wide elective offices. It also provides a chance for minority groups to be heard on the air.

Representatives of the party organizations and independent candidates met with a WHA representative in the secretary of state's office and planned the program. The practice of giving free time for political discussions was started by the station in 1932.

It has been characterized as "the most democratic political broadcasting in America."

## Princess Elizabeth on Air Today; FDR to Make C. U. Appeal

Two appeals headline today's airwaves.

At 10:15 a. m. through stations WIBA, WGN, and WBBM, Princess Elizabeth will address the children of the British empire from bomb-torn London. The 14-year-old daughter of King George VI, who one day probably will become Queen Elizabeth II, will speak for the first time on the air. Her subject will be her personal experiences in the war.

President Roosevelt will make the second appeal when he launches the annual Mobilization for Human Needs (Community Union) drive. He will broadcast at 9:30 p. m. over stations WIBA, WMAQ, and WBBM. Edward Arnold will act as the program's master-of-ceremonies with Penny Singleton and Arthur Lake presenting a "Blondie" sketch to complete the appeal.
