**10:00 a. m., WRC**—Ruth Gordon, one of the fine actresses of the stage, joins film actor Ralph Bellamy for a doctor-wife dramatization on Lincoln Highway.

**12:00 noon, WMAL**—"How to Judge the Adequacy of Schools for National Defense" is the subject of the new Education Forum, designed to interest laymen as well as professional educators.

**1:30 p. m., WJSV and WRC**—His Holiness Pope Pius XII speaks from his library in the Vatican appealing to America for support of the Roman Catholic Church's missionary activities, tomorrow being set apart to promote the aims of the Society for the Propagation of Faith.

**2:00, WRC and WMAL**—While WRC airs the Harvard-Army football game, the other station broadcasts the Ohio-Minnesota struggle.

**3:15, WOL**—Mutual airs the Alabama-Tennessee football game.

**6:15, WJSV and WMAL**—The Columbia and National networks join forces to broadcast from a London air-raid shelter.
