11 a. m.. WOL—President Roosevelt and Mayor LaGuardia speak at the ground-breaking exercises of the new Battery-Brooklyn tunnel. There is a possibility that several other local stations also may carry this ceremony.

9 p. m.. WMAL—Thomas E. Dewey speaks for the Republican National Committee in Peoria, Ill.

9. WJSV—Those energetic youngsters of the screen. Mickey Rooney and Judy Garland, appear in a radio version of their current film hit, "Strike Up the Band."

10. WRC and WMAL—From Madison Square Garden, the Democratic National Committee broadcasts a giant rally. Senator Robert F. Wagner, of New York, speaks first, introducing President Roosevelt, who goes on the air at 10:15.

10:30. WJSV—Wendell Willkie continues his campaign with an address from Louisville, Ky.

10:45. WOL—Communist candidate Earl Browder makes a campaign speech originally set for tomorrow night.

11. WRC—California's Senator Hiram Johnson continues his support of Willkie.

11:15. WOL—Assistant Secretary of the Navy Louis Compton and Rear Admiral George W. Reeves address a Navy Day celebration in Baltimore.

1 a. m.. WOL—Frank Young begins his widely heralded Dawn Patrol series, thus putting the local Mutual outlet on the air 24 hours a day through the week. He holds open house every week-night at the studios, 1627 K Street Northwest.
