4:15, **WJSV, WMAL and WOL**—President Roosevelt speaks at the dedication of the National Institute of Health and Cancer Research Building in Bethesda, introduced by Paul V. McNutt, Federal security administrator, and Dr. Thomas Parran, United States Surgeon General.

7:15, **WJSV**—Here's our first hint of the day that it's Halloween. Lanny Ross offers a group of appropriately superstitious songs.

8:30, **WJSV**—Wendell L. Willkie makes a campaign address in Camden, N. J.
