

# Ben Bernie Offers Election Theme On Musicquiz Show

Ol' Maestro Presents "If I'm Elected" As Feature Number; Song Inspired By Conscription On "Johnny Presents"

There'll be a hot time on the Ben Bernie program Election Night when the Ol' Maestro sounds the first election note by singing "If I'm Elected" on the Ben Bernie Musicquiz Tuesday, 8:00 p. m., Nov. 5, over WABC. Carol Bruce will sing "Down Argentina Way." The Bailey Sisters and Bernie will give out with the novelty number, "Johnny Peddler." The orchestra will feature "Ferryboat Serenade" and the closing will be "I Am An American" featuring all the lads, Carol Bruce, the Bailey Sisters and the Ol' Maestro himself.

One of the first songs inspired by military conscription is due for airing on the "Johnny Presents" program over WEAJ Tuesday, at 8 p. m. It is "They're Making Me All Over In the Army" and will be done in a special Ray Block arrangement by the Swing Fourteen. A football medley by Block's orchestra will be another feature and colleges to be musically saluted are University of Pennsylvania, Columbia and Tulane. The program also includes a radio dramatization adapted by Charles Martin.

The "Information Please" board of experts' table in Radio City studios will present a familiar sight for WJZ broadcast, Tuesday, Nov. 5, at 8:30 p. m. Along one side, facing Clifton Fadiman, quizmaster, will sit the combination most often heard

in the program's two and a half years of broadcasting.

Besides John Kieran and Franklin P. Adams, week-in-and-week-out regulars, and Oscar Levant, heard about every other week, there will be Christopher Morley, author, and senior guest of the program. This appearance will mark Morley's eleventh time as a guest expert.

Four leading ladies and four leading men, of the cost of the Paramount film, "Arise My Love," will take the field for the Battle of the Sexes Tuesday at 9:00 p. m., over WEAJ.

The presence of Cliff Nazarro, radio's double-talk expert, will give the men's team, captained by Frank Crumit, a verbal edge over the women's squad, commanded by Julia Sanderson. Crumit's force includes Nazarro, Walter Abel, Dick Purcell and Denis O'Keefe. On the enemy squad are Lillian Cornell, Ellen Drew, Constance Moore and Patricia Morrison.

Ronnie Keemper, new singing star of the Horace Heidt band, will feature "Gimme A Little Kiss" on the Treasure Chest program Tuesday, 8:30 p. m. over WEAJ. Donna and her Don Juans will sing "Ragpicker." Other numbers on the half hour show are "Song of India," "Campton Girl," and "Washington & Lee Swing."

The henpecked Mortimer Meek finally gets an opportunity to "Make a Speech" in Wednesday's CBS "Meet Mr. Meek" (Nov. 6, 7:30 p. m.) -- not that he especially wants to. The situation comes about when a renowned speaker is scheduled for an appearance at the Husbands and Wives meeting of the Midweek club. Mr. Meek's boss, Mr. Barker, is supposed to handle the job of introducing the speaker, but he gets cold feet and puts it off on Mortimer.
