10:58 a. m., **WMAL, WRC and WJSV**—President Roosevelt speaks at the laying of wreaths on the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, an American Legion Observance which will be preceded by a moment of silence in tribute to the soldier dead.

12:30 p. m., **WMAL**—Milo J. Warner, commander of the American Legion, addresses the annual convention of the Future Farmers of America in Kansas City, Mo.

3:30, **WJSV, WRC and WOL**—President Roosevelt makes a Nation-wide talk as he lays the cornerstone for the new Naval Medical Center at the National Institute of Health in Bethesda, being the second time within two weeks that he has spoken from the Federal Government's health project in Maryland.

3:45, **WOL**—Mercury passes between the sun and the earth, the first time this has happened since 1927 and the last until 1953. Mutual airs the airplane view and the interpretation of the Hayden Planetarium people.

9:45, **WMAL**—Gordon Hittenmark describes the opening of the "Ice Follies" at the Riverside Stadium.

10:30, **ALL STATIONS**—Wendell Willkie states his views on his future policy as head of the Republican Party.

11:15, **WOL**—The Chicago Opera Company begins a series of Monday broadcasts for Mutual. Tonight's "Pagliacci" stars Helen Jepson, Giovanni Martinelli and John Charles Thomas.

11:15, **WJSV**—Gen. Marshall speaks at the V. M. I. Founder's Day in conjunction with Armistice Day.
