

Franklin's Diplomacy Dramatized On Broad

Cavalcade Players To Show How E Resulted In Alliance Between F United States

The story of Benjamin Franklin's diplomacy of Louis XVI which resulted in an alliance between the United States and France will be told in the drama "Dr Franklin Goes to Court," and will be presented by the Cavalcade Players as the venerable Dr. Ben Franklin. The program will be broadcast Wednesday over WEA at 7:30 p. m.

Thirty-one year old Douglas Leigh, designer of Broadway's newest, biggest, most spectacular animated cartoon sign—will be the person you don't expect to meet on the Star theatre program Wednesday at 9:00 p. m. over WABC, when Fred Allen interviews him.
