With lovely Jean Arthur as guest star, Kate Smith will present her variety hour from Tucson, Ariz., to celebrate the world premiere of the motion picture, "Arizona" over WABC Friday at 8 p. m.

She will be in New York in person to tell her unusual story to Ripley and his audience.

Lucille Manners, soprano star of the Cities Service concerts, will sing "I Give You My Word" by Kavelin, during the broadcast, Friday, at 8 p. m. over WEF.
