

"Salute To Mansfield" To Be Heard Via WTAM Friday

Louis Bromfield, Famous Novelist, Will Speak On Program; Ripley To Present Grid Performer

A "Salute to Mansfield" will be broadcast Friday from 10:30 to 11 p. m. over WTAM, built around famous men who made their homes in Mansfield, and Richland-co, including Johnny Appleseed; John Sherman, famous senator from Ohio and candidate for United States president; Frank G. Carpenter, foreign newspaper correspondent once known as "The Modern Marco Polo"; and Louis Bromfield, novelist and Pulitzer prize winner.

The broadcast will consist of dramatic sketches, narrated pictures, musical interludes by Lee Gordon's orchestra, a reading of Bromfield's "The Wedding Gown" and a short talk by Bromfield, himself.

Bob Krieger, who kicked the winning field goal for Dartmouth in the famous "fifth down" 3 to 0 victory over Cornell, will be on Bob Ripley's program Friday at 10 p. m., on WABC. He's second tenor in the Dartmouth Glee club to be featured on that show.

The Dartmouth Glee club of 40 voices will be making its second appearance on a Bob Ripley program this year.
