In addition to the stations listed in the log below, WINX, broadcasting on 1310 kilocycles, is on the air from 6:30 a. m. until 1 the following morning. Its programs include on-the-hour news broadcasts from 9 a. m. to 5 p. m., resuming them again from 7 through midnight. One of the features of the new all-local station is the sports column conducted by Shirley Povich, whose column "This Morning" appears daily in The Post.

9:45 A. M., WRC—Walter Sweeney talks to Mary Mason of the legitimate theater.

12:30 P. M., WMAL—The twentieth anniversary of farm market news broadcasting is observed on the National Farm and Home Hour.

8, WRC—For their Telephone Hour solos, Francia White and James Melton have chosen songs from Fritz Kreisler, "Stars in My Eyes" and "Caprice Viennois."
