

FDR Heralds at Community Party Tuesday

President Roosevelt's Yuletide greetings to the nation will be heard Tuesday at 4 p. m., through WIBA, WMAQ, WBBM, and WGN, from the 18th annual community Christmas tree-lighting ceremonies in Washington. It will be the eighth time the president has taken part in the capital's Christmas eve event. Mrs. Roosevelt will also participate.
