WMAL—"What Is Youth's Role in Defense of Democracy?" is the subject of America's Town Meeting of the Air, meeting tonight in Bayfront Park, Miami, at the invitation of the city to inaugurate a three-day session of the Congress on Education for Democracy. Speakers are Senator Claude D. Pepper, President George Barton Cutten, of Colgate University; Carl F. Zeidler, mayor of Milwaukee, and a Florida boy or girl chosen from one of the State high schools.

10:30. WRC—Jessica Dragonette, favorite of millions, may have no regular program of her own these days, but she's keeping busy as an honored guest. Tonight she sings "Alice Blue Gown" and "Home, Sweet Home", with Raymond Paige and his orchestra.
