## ARMY REJECTS DRAFTEES FROM PUTNAM BOARD

OTTAWA, Feb. 11—Three of the 11 young men sent to the army induction center at Toledo Saturday from Putnam-co were rejected, it was learned today by county selective service officials.

The 11 men were replacements for rejections on the Jan. 20 quota for this county. The board will send three replacements for these last three rejections as quickly as it can make arrangements with the men and the induction center.

In the meantime, six young men left by bus this morning for Toledo to fill the latest quota. Another group of five selectees is being assembled to leave Feb. 28.

No official order has been received, but board officials have learned that the next draft call will be for the first week in March. No estimates have been obtained on the number of men to be called at that time.
