

# 'Free Company' Offers Anti-Propaganda Play on WBBM at 1 Today

The Free Company, organized to combat foreign propaganda with "The American Way," will make its initial appearance today when an original play by William Saroyan, "The People with Light Coming Out of Them," is presented through WBBM at 1 p. m. Burgess Meredith will serve as narrator.

In Saroyanesque manner, the play achieves its impact through simplicity of speech by "just ordinary folks" who reveal through their neighborly small talk what it means to enjoy.
