

Rare Instrumental Quartet Set On Chamber Music Spot

Case Of Aaron Burr Will Be Dramatized During
"Famous Jury Trials" Scheduled At 7
P. M. Monday

The "Fortissimo Four," a rare instrumental quartet which blows hot and cold at the drop of a "pizzicato", will park with the "Chamber Music Society of Lower Basin Street" during the weekly sitting, Monday, at 9:35 p. m. over WJZ.

Stirring overtures by "Dr." Henry Levine's Dixieland Little Symphony and "Maestro" Paul Laval's "Ten Babes Lost in the Woodwinds," will highlight the main course. Dolores O'Neill will serve the aperitifs with an "au gratin" blues vocal, soufflé style, while chairman "Dr." Gino Hamilton does nip-ups with a goose-neck microphone.

The controversial case of Aaron Burr, whose peculiar niche in America's history is based on his equal facility with the duelling pistol and politician's pen, will be dramatized during "Famous Jury Trials," Monday at 7 p. m. over WJZ.
