COURT UPHOLDS MAN'S RIGHT TO RUN LUNCHROOM

COLUMBUS, O., March 6 - (UP) Sidney A. Miller's right to operate a basement lunch room in the Ohio bureau of unemployment compensation today had the support of the state supreme court.

Miller, a Democrat, indicated he would seek an injunction suit to oust his fourth-floor competitor, Gus Zarnas, former Ohio State all-America football player, a Republican.

Zarnas had the backing of Republican BUC Administrator H. C. Atkinson, who instigated ouster proceedings against Miller. Both the common pleas and appellate
