

Boxing, on WIBA Tonight

Covering national events from east to west tonight, WIBA will broadcast the national collegiate basketball title game in Kansas City, Mo., President Roosevelt's Jackson day address in Washington, and the finals of the National Boxing Tournament in State College, Pa.

From Kansas City, Bill Walker will come on the air at 8:20 to describe the scene in Kansas City's Civic auditorium, where Wisconsin and Washington State clash at 8:30 for the national intercollegiate championship.

A direct wire has been installed at the press table in the Kansas City auditorium, running directly to the WIBA studios in the Tenney Bldg., and WIBA listeners will be able to hear all the excitement, referee's whistle and the cheers of the crowd.

The special broadcast facilities to Kansas City were installed Friday, and with Walker arriving there today, everything is in readiness for tonight's big event.

Final bouts in the National Intercollegiate Tournament at State College, Pa., will be described for WIBA listeners beginning at 7. Blow-by-blow accounts of each match will be relayed to the WIBA audience by Art Lentz.

In order that WIBA listeners may hear both President Roosevelt and the basketball game, Station WIBA has arranged to transcribe the President's address and will broadcast it tonight at 10:30.

The president will speak at 8:30 from Washington, and the stations of the major networks, including WMAQ and WBBM, will carry the address at 8:30.
