#### Drake Relays

Outstanding events of the 32nd annual Drake Relay carnival at Des Moines, Ia., Friday and Saturday will be described over WIBA by Bill Stern, NBC's sports-caster. In addition to the track and field events, Stern also will officiate at the crowning of the Drake Relays queen Saturday.

Preliminary events will be summarized and the finals of the university distance medley relay race will be described by Stern during the first broadcast at 4 p. m. Friday.

On Saturday, Stern will broadcast intermittently from 2 to 4:30, covering such events as the 120-yard high hurdles, the 480-yard shuttle hurdle relay, the 440-yard university relay; the two-mile relay, the mile relay and the special one and one-half mile run.
