

Thousand' ds Subject k Tonight

President, Roosevelt will take to the air again tonight, this time explaining the "dime to a thousand" defense savings bonds which go on sale Thursday at all postoffices. He will speak at 8:30 p. m. through WIBA and all major network stations of NBC, CBS, and Mutual systems.

Vice President Henry A. Wallace and three other party leaders will speak to the New York Young Democrats tonight at 9 through WIBA and WENR. Besides Wallace, James A. Farley, former postmaster general; Edward J. Flynn, chairman of the Democratic National committee, and Gov. Herbert H. Lehman, New York, will speak.
