Public Affairs

Three special broadcasts from the Wisconsin Public Affairs institute on National Defense in Action will be aired by WIBA on Friday and Saturday.

The symposium addresses of Pres. C. A. Dykstra and Marvin B. Rosenberry, chief justice of the supreme court, will be heard Friday at approximately 10:30 a. m. They will speak under the general title, "Defense of What?" (Also on WHA).

The Saturday morning session, with George P. Hambrecht presiding, will be on the air at 9:30, with a symposium, "The Home Front." Speakers will include Horace J. Sprague, of the American Red Cross; Mark A. McCloskey, of the National Defense program; Robert Gilchrist, of the National Youth Administration; and Nelle Nordstrum, of the advisory commission to the Council of National Defense.

Howard Y. McCluskey, of the American Youth Commission, will be the luncheon speaker on Saturday, and will be heard through WIBA at 1:30 p. m. on "Youth and National Defense."
