Four varied types of music—a fugue, a prelude, a symphony and a rhapsody—will be conducted by Reginald Stewart during the NBC Summer Symphony, tonight through WIBA from 7:30 to 8 and WCFL from 7:30 to 8:30 p. m.

Stewart himself has transcribed for orchestra Mendelssohn's Fugue in E Minor and the Bach choral prelude, "I Call on Thee, Lord," the two works which will open the program. These will be followed by Mozart's famous Symphony in G Minor No. 40 (K. 550), and, as a concluding selection, Rumanian Rhapsody No. 1, the best-known of three Rumanian rhapsodies by Georges Enesco.
