

# y, Navy analyze Tonight

S. E. Thomason, editor and publisher of the Chicago Daily Times, will present a newspaperman's views of world affairs when he speaks through WENR at 7 tonight. He will address the Chicago Association of Credit Men.

“The Air Defense of America” will be discussed by army and navy flying officers in a program to be broadcast from Atlantic City and over WIBA Thursday morning at 9:30.

George V. Denny will conduct the program, which is part of the General Federation of Women's Clubs annual convention. The navy representatives include Capt. Charles Perry Mason, of the naval air station at Jacksonville, Fla.; Commander Austin K. Doyle, of the bureau of aeronautics, and Ensign William A. Shyrock of the Jacksonville naval air station.

Representing the army will be Brig. Gen. John D. Brooks, of Westover field at Chicopee Falls, Mass.; Lt. Col. Arthur I. Ennis, of the war department's bureau of public relations.
