President Roosevelt's fireside chat will be broadcast at 8:30 tonight over virtually every station in the United States which is affiliated with a nationwide network. In this area it will be carried by WIBA, WENR, WMAQ, WGN, WBBM, and others. The speech also will be aired simultaneously by short wave stations beamed toward other nations in the Americas, and complete translations will be broadcast later in five foreign languages for listeners there and in other parts of the world.
