

# Eucharistic Congress Reception Highlights Tonight's Airwaves

Radio will cover the Ninth National Eucharistic congress at St. Paul, Minn., in a series of special broadcasts.

Tonight, through WIBA at 9:30, the reception for the papal legate, His Eminence Dennis Cardinal Dougherty of Philadelphia, will be described. Gov. Harold E. Stassen, Minnesota and the Most Rev. John Gregory Murray, archbishop of St. Paul, will give short addresses of welcome as will the mayors of the Twin Cities. Music will be provided by the Catholic Choral society.
