

Thin Man, Air Tonight

Three new programs will hit the airwaves tonight—a variety show in the interests of national defense, a series of dramatizations, and a quiz program.

"Millions for Defense," with a lineup of topflight stars, will be broadcast at 7 over WBBM as part of the campaign for sale of national defense bonds and stamps. Secretary of the Treasury Morgenthau will dedicate the program, and Mayor H. E. Lamberston of Philadelphia will strike the Liberty bell during the proceedings.

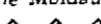
