

Roosevelt Will Discuss of Present War Friday

An address by President Roosevelt will be radio's chief attraction Friday — Independence day. He will speak at the climax of a nationwide observance of the holiday in which bands throughout the land are expected to play "The Star Spangled Banner" with the U. S. Marine band, and millions of Americans will recite the oath of allegiance. The president probably will discuss dangers inherent in the European war.

The program will start at 2:55 p. m. on WBBM, at 3 p. m. on WIBA, WENR, WGN, WCFL, WLW, and WMAQ.
