## U. S. MEDIATION BOARD IS BUSY

Auto Parts Company Strike Studied As Shipyard Walk-out Is Deferred

(By The Associated Press)

The defense mediation board sought today to have strikers resume production at the Scaled Power Corp. in Muskegon, Mich., which makes parts for automobile and engine companies working on defense orders.

AFL's United Automobile Workers walked out after failing to obtain demanded wage increases and a union shop. The mediation board began an inquiry into the dispute and asked the workers to get back on the job in the meanwhile.

The board persuaded members of a CIO shipyard union at the Federal Shipbuilding Corp. in Kearny, N. J., to defer a strike which had been called to support demands for a union shop and paid vacations.

A conciliator from the labor department undertook to settle a strike of 60 AFL building workers at a \$2,500,000 naval ammunition dump project in San Diego, Calif. Union members walked out after asserting the contracting company had breached an agree-
