

Exploits Of Young French Pilot Will Be Dramatized

Edmund Genet's Story As Member Of Lafayette Escadrille May Be Heard At 9 P. M. Friday On WEAJ Broadcast

Young Edmund Genet's story while enlisted in the French Foreign Legion and the famous Lafayette Escadrille will be told during "Wings of Destiny," Friday, at 9 p. m. over WEAJ.

Only sixteen years old, he lied about his age and joined up with the Foreign Legion. He was transferred to the Lafayette Escadrille in 1917, was shot down on the morning of April 16 in that year, altho still not yet 18. A Croix de Guerre was his reward for carrying the tri-color of France into the battle of the skies.

HIGHWAY GRASS PROJECT ENDS IN PUTNAM-CO

OTTAWA, July 18 — Work on the WPA project on State Route 113, near Leipsic, will be completed Saturday, it was reported here today by J. J. Miller, county WPA superintendent.

More than two miles of highway have been widened while new berms and drainage facilities have been constructed with the berms being seeded. About 18 tons of dry straw have been spread over the berms to protect the grass seed.

It is the plan of the state highway department to follow this work by re-surfacing the highway with a bituminous material soon. Completion of the WPA portion of the job will release a crew of men for work on the Kirkendall rd. on the Palmer-Monroe tp line, northwest of here. The job is partially completed and work is expected to start there July 22.
