Secretary of the Treasury Henry Morgenthau, Jr., will be on the air twice tonight.

At 6:30 p. m., through WLS, he will dedicate the new NBC defense program, "For America We Sing." The program, all-American music with all-American artists as soloists, will have Dorothy Maynor, Negro soprano, and Frank Munn, tenor, as guests on the initial broadcast. Miss Maynor will be heard singing "Swing Low, Sweet Chariot" and "Roll On, Jordan." Munn's selections will include "Home on the Range" and "Home Sweet Home."

At 8:15 p. m. over WBBM, Morgenthau will preside over a round-table discussion on defense savings bonds with Albert Hawks, president of the United States Chamber of Commerce; John A. Phillips, chairman of the Railway Labor Executives assn.; Walter D. Fuller, president of the National Association of Manufacturers; William Green, president of the American Federation of Labor, and Philip Murray, president of the Congress of Industrial Organizations participating.
