Lionel And John To Offer Skit On Talent School, With Vallee; Bertrand Russell Guest Of Rex Stout's Session

The program, off for a Summer run in the popular Thursday evening spot, features music by Benny Goodman's orchestra and septet, vocals by the King's Jesters, a brief drama, and comedy doings under the general guidance of Don McNeill.

LONE CRUSADER TOILS TO SPREAD SAFETY ADVICE

PITTSBURGH, July 21.—(UP)—H. M. Ramsey, retired locomotive engineer, has set himself up as a one man safety council.

Founder, director and working staff of the National Community Safety Council, Ramsey spends much of his time cruising about the city distributing safety literature and enrolling members in his organization.

Headquarters of the council, which as yet has not expanded beyond Pittsburgh despite its "national" title, are at Ramsey's home. It is a non-profit organization, and collects no dues.

Ramsey carries an armful of safety pamphlets when he goes about town, and distributes them to pedestrians he sees jaywalking or to any other persons who may be violating safety rules. He shakes their hand, and invites them to membership in his council. If they join, he puts them on a mailing list for safety literature.
