

Chinese Leader Broadcast Today British Children, U. S. Admiral,

Broadcasts from the East and West will highlight today's airwaves.

At 11 a. m. through WIBA young Britons living in New England and six Canadian cities will speak to their parents in war-torn London.

From London at 3:30 p. m. Admiral William H. Standley, United States navy retired, will discuss American shipping in war waters and its protection. WBBM will broadcast the trans-Atlantic message.

WBBM will carry a special broadcast from the heart of warring China at 5:15 p. m. H. H. Kung, vice-premier of the Chinese republic, will speak from the capital at Chungking.
