"Dr." McCarthy Heads Latest Boogie-Woogie Session; Story Of Cliff Holland Offered On Cavalcade

With Art Tatum, noted boogie-woogie pianist, as guest star, and "Dr. Giacomo" (Fluff-mouth) McCarthy (whose "a's" are as broad as his beam), as "chairman," another friendly little melee with the "Chamber Music Society of Lower Basin Street" will pulse out over the azure airwaves of WJZ Monday, at 8:00 p. m.

"Dr." McCarthy will preside over future recitals of the society, which feature "Maestro" Paul Laval's Double Woodwind Quintet; "Dr." Henry Levine's High Octane Octet, and the sweet murmurings of "Diva" Diane Courtney.

A new song by Erich Korngold, distinguished composer, "You Haunt My Heart," which is based on a Strauss melody, will be sung for the first time on the air by James Melton, tenor, during the "Telephone Hour," Monday at 7:00 p. m. over WEAJ.

Melton will also be heard in "Sanctus" by Gounod. Francis White, soprano, has chosen for her solo "Summer" by Chamade. Together they will offer

the duet, "We Could Make Such Beautiful Music" by Chamade.

The story of Clifford Holland, the engineer, and of the "sand-hogs" who burrowed beneath New York City's great rivers to build the huge tunnels he designed, will be told on the "Cavalcade of America" program, Monday at 6:30 p. m. over WEAJ.
