

Helen Jepson, Frank Parker To Be Guests Tuesday Night

Vocalists Will Appear On Second "For America We Sing" Program; William And Mary College Will Be Saluted

Helen Jepson, Metropolitan Opera soprano, and Frank Parker, one of America's leading tenor soloists, will be guest artists on the second "For America We Sing" program, Tuesday, at 7:30 p. m., over WJZ.

The program includes a medley of Southern songs: "Dixie" by Emmet, "I'se Gwine Back to Dixie" by White and "Carry Me Back to Ole Virginnny" by Bland, the last to be sung by Miss Jepson. She will also be heard in "Just a Song at Twilight" by Molloy.

Parker has chosen for his solos Rich Hall's "Cowboy Serenade" and Foster's "Beautiful Dreamer." The orchestra, assisted by the choir, will complete the program with the traditional western tune, "Billy Boy," "Oh Dem Golden Slippers," the "Loyal Legion March" by Sousa and "America" by Carey.
