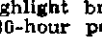


# Saturdaytimes Air O riety, Shows, Hor

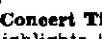


Other highlight broadcasts for the next 30-hour period follow, classified:

8 p. m. — **R. Douglas Stuart, Jr.** (WIBA): the national director of the America First Committee in "Search of Faith."

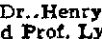

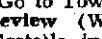
8:30 p. m.—**First Piano Quartet** (WENR): an all-Russian program.

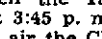

7 p. m. — **Great Moments from Great Plays** (WBBM): James Warwick's "Blind Alley," a psychological drama in crimedom.

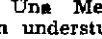
8 p. m.—**Wings of Destiny** (WMAQ): "A Rookie Arrives," gallantry in the air.
