

# Glenn Miller Broadcasts To Be Dedicated To U. S. Forces

Army Training Centers To Receive Musical Tribute; Dr. George V. Denny, Jr., On "Information Please" Hour

The inimitable music of Glenn Miller, his acrobatic trombone and his famous orchestra will run riot in a "Sunset Serenade" each Saturday over WJZ from 4 to 5 p. m. in a new series dedicated to the nation's selective service men and their army camps, beginning Saturday.

With the cooperation of the United Service Organizations, the new Glenn Miller program will each week present an album of 50 top-ranking records to five different army camps.

The new program, officially titled "Glenn Miller's Sunset Serenade," will be dedicated to and fashioned for the men in the army camps. But another army—the nation's collegiate jitterbugs, the swing and jive addicts and the millions who are captivated by the swaying harmony of Glenn and his players will be no less

agitated by the new series, which each Saturday will pay a musical tribute to five of the army's training centers.

George V. Denny, Jr., conductor of another famous radio program, "America's Town Meeting of the Air," will be seated at the uncomfortable table of the board of experts when "Information Please" is heard over WEAJ Friday at 7:30 p. m.

Second guest expert, serving with John Kieran and Franklin P. Adams, will be Christopher Morley, novelist, who will be coming back for his twelfth session at the table.

Before rehearsal one day recently, Lucille Manners, soprano star of the "Cities Service" program, heard her accompanist, Charlotte Brinsler, improvising a melody on the piano. She liked it. "Why don't you write words to it," Miss Manners suggested.

The accompanist took the advice and a few days later came up with a love ballad entitled, "Better Think It Over." Miss Manners will introduce it on the "Cities Service" program, Friday at 7 p. m. over WEAJ. She also will be heard in Mozart's "All-luia."

The world's newest profession, that of short-wave news monitor, will be discussed by Dr. Orestes H. Caldwell during his "Radio Magic" program over WJZ Friday at 6:15 p. m.

A typhoid epidemic in a quake-stricken area, miles from civilization, will furnish the drama for "Wings of Destiny," Friday at 9 p. m. over WEAJ.

The drama will depict the flight made by Major C. V. Haynes, who flew from France Field, Canal Zone, to Santiago, Chile, with a load of medical supplies after the 1939 earthquake.
