

'Defense For America' Airs Story From Pullman Plant

Activities Of Manufacture Of Tanks Will Be Described At 6 P. M. Saturday Over WEAF

Activities of the Pullman Standard Co. in building airplane wings, ME 28-ton tanks, and 105-mm. howitzer gun carriages will be described during "Defense for America" over WEAF Saturday at 6 p. m.

The broadcast opens in Chicago studios with short talks by C. R. Little, president of Pullman Standard; Wallace Parker, vice president in charge of production and Col. Donald Armstrong, Chief of Chicago Ordnances.

It then is to shift to the plant at Pullman, Ill., where Announcer Don Cardray plans to interview Frank M. Gunn, general superintendent of the plant.

In conclusion, the program will switch to the company's Hammond, Ind., plant so that Graham McNamee may interview Ray Fox, the superintendent, and describe an exacting field test as it is given one of the monster Pullman tanks.

Laszlo Halasz, brilliant young conductor of the St. Louis Opera-ssn and a dominant musical figure in the middle west, will make his first appearance with the NBC Summer Symphony as its guest director on Saturday over WJZ at 8:30 p. m.
