Uncle Sam's Largest "Family" Will Broadcast Via WJZ At 7:15 P. M. With Program From Battleship Nevada

The U. S. Navy's "largest family" is getting even larger and the addition of its newest recruit will be broadcast from 7 to 7:15 p. m., over WJZ Tuesday, with Secretary of the Navy Frank Knox participating.

The Navy's largest family is the seven Patten brothers—Bruce, Ray, Allen, Myrne, Clarence, Marvin and Gilbert—all stationed aboard the U. S. S. Nevada. The newest addition is their father, Clarence F. Patten, of Odebolt, Iowa, who is joining his sons aboard the mighty battlewagon.

The program will be aired from the Nevada, "somewhere at sea," where the ceremonies in which Patten, Sr., is inducted in the U. S. Navy will be broadcast. The elder Patten, who recently enlisted to join his sons, will be a fireman, first class.
