

Presidential Talk Will Be Broadcast All Over World

Delay In Roosevelt's Address Until Thursday Night Gives Networks Time To Plan For More Comprehensive Coverage

Postponement until Thursday night of President Roosevelt's broadcast is giving the networks more time to complete arrangements to make it a world-wide transmission.

The talk, first announced for Monday night but now delayed because of the death of the President's mother, has been set for the 15-minute period starting at 9 p. m. Stations of the three American networks, of the Canadian chain and in South America, as well as shortwave units, are to be hooked up for the direct transmission.

Previously-announced network programs either are being delayed or cancelled for the broadcast.

Edna Heenan, of Richmond, Va., a 12-year-old history whiz, and Van Dyke Tiers, 11, a formidable opponent on past sessions, will be guest brain-trusters on the "Quiz Kids" program, over WJZ.
