

Roosevelt Speaks From W at 8 Tonight Through All

President Roosevelt will address the world from the White House tonight at 8 through WIBA and all major network stations. He will deliver the speech postponed from Monday by the death of his mother, Mrs. Sara Delano Roosevelt. The president scheduled his talk following the submarine attack on the United States destroyer Greer.

Reactions to the address will be heard at 10:05 p. m. from London, Buenos Aires, New York, and Washington. WIBA will conclude the world-wide broadcast with a roundtable discussion by William Hillman, Earl Godwin, H. V. Kaltenborn, and Ernest K. Lindley.
