THESIS WRITTEN ON ANT TROOPS

"Social Hormones" Take Care
Of Soldier Needs To Eliminate Draft

CHICAGO, Sept. 12—(UP)—If you were an ant, you'd never have to worry about being drafted for the army—and not because ants don't have armies.

When an ant colony is short of defending soldiers, it's all taken care of by "social hormones," according to Dr. Robert E. Gregg who reported his findings in a dissertation submitted for the doctor's degree in zoology at the University of Chicago's summer convocation.

The ants' system is much more automatic than drawing capsules from a gold fish bowl, Gregg indicated. And what's more, it produces exactly the right number of soldiers.

Ants are born equal, according to Gregg's hypothesis, but if a col-
