All-Star Cast Will Accompany Red-Haired Wit; Singing Star Joins Fibber McGee And Molly

Red Skelton, flaming-haired comedian, returns to the air Tuesday, with a new variety show at 10:30 p. m., over WEAF replacing "College Humor" in that spot, and under the same sponsorship.

An all-star cast will join Skelton in his half-hour of fun and music.

Ozzie Nelson, famous orchestra leader, will be chief music maker, with lovely Harriet Hilliard as soloist. The couple,

long favorites of radio audiences and dancing throngs, were featured on "Seeing Stars" from Hollywood in 1937-38, the same season in which Skelton made his debut as a guest star. Wonderful Smith, celebrated Negro comedy star, will be Skelton's chief stogge and heckler, and Truman Bradley will announce.

Blondie Martha Tilton, singing star of many programs, has joined the permanent cast of WEAF's "Fibber McGee and Molly" broadcast, and will be featured vocalist of the new series heard Tuesdays at 9:30 p. m., E. S. T. She made her debut on the program in its first broadcast after the vacation period on Sept. 30.
