WIBA to Air Dane-Columbia Husking Contest

Plans have been completed for WIBA's first coverage of the annual Dane-Columbia county cornhusking contest, to be held Thursday on the Julian Krebs farm, just north of Sun Prairie.

Three broadcasts are planned with the cooperation of the Sun Prairie Lions' club.

The first broadcast will be heard at 10:45 a. m. with Al Gilbert at the microphone to describe the preparations and activities preceding the start. Cornhusking begins at 11 a. m. Individual contestants will be interviewed before they take their places.

The WIBA "Farm Roundup" at 11:45 a. m. will describe contest progress up to that time; present interviews with persons connected with the other features of the day's program and explain methods used to determine the winner after husking ends at 12:20 p. m.

The final broadcast will include interviews with the Dane and Columbia county champion cornhuskers, and a revue of the standings
