Kay Francis To Head Cavalcade Of America Cast In Broadcast From Hollywood; New Opera Star To Be Heard

Richard Crooks, leading tenor of the Metropolitan Opera Company, Monday night begins his fall and winter series of radio concerts on the "Voice of Firestone" program. The nationwide WEAF broadcast is aired at 8:30 and again at 11:30 for West Coast audiences.

Monday, at 7:30 p. m., Cavalcade Of America will be broadcast from Hollywood with an all-star cast featuring lovely Kay Francis. Cavalcade producers have chosen the brilliant

new novel Waters of The Wilderness by Shirley Seifert as the vehicle for the first of two programs scheduled for broadcast from the west coast.

Latest star in the opera world comes to the microphone on "For America We Sing" over WJZ Monday, at 9:30 p. m. She is Lydia Summers, shining light of the New Opera Co., sponsored by Mrs. Lytle Hull, the former Mrs. Vincent Astor. Miss Summers first came to attention when she sang with the Chicago Opera Co., in 1940. Sharing the kiloycles with her will be Felix Knight, tenor, who has carved a niche for himself in radio, concert and motion pictures. Orchestral music on "For America We Sing" is conducted by Dr. Frank Black who also directs the large choir.
