Kate Smith will present Donald Crisp, veteran Hollywood star, in an original drama; Ed "Archie" Gardner, in a scene from his famous Duffy's Tavern, and "Hi, Lo, Jack and The Dame," novelty vocal group, on her Variety Hour broadcast with Ted Collins and Jack Miller's band over WABC Friday at 8 p. m.
