

Armistice Day Ceremonies, President's Arlington Address to Feature Tuesday Air Shows

The elaborate American Legion Armistice day ceremonies at Arlington National cemetery, including a talk by President Roosevelt, will be broadcast by WIBA and all major network stations at 9:58 Tuesday morning. The broadcast opens with a brief description of the president placing a wreath on the tomb of the Unknown Soldier. This will be followed by the traditional one minute of silence. The program will then move to the amphitheater for the president's speech.
