"They Died With Their Boots On" Will Have Film Star In Title Role; Broadcast Scheduled For 7:30 P. M.

Errol Flynn will star as General George A. Custer, in "They Died With Their Boots On", soon-to-be-released motion picture of the same name, on Cavalcade of America, Monday at 7:30 p. m. over WFAA.

As General George A. Custer, Flynn will reenact the colorful story of Custer's life from the time of his graduation from West Point until he left for the memorable battle at Little Big Horn, Montana.
