

Gang Busters To Tell Fate Of Vicious Border Murderer

Kate Smith's Annual All-Collegiate Football Team Will Be Announced During Program Friday Evening

The dramatic career of the killer of the Texas-Oklahoma border country who feared imprisonment more than he did death, will be presented as the "Gang Busters" case to be heard over WJZ Friday from 9 to 9:30 p. m.

The presentation, originally scheduled for the previous Friday, was postponed for a week as radio directors, writers and actors worked feverishly to present the case of Juanita "Duchess" Spinelli, 33, whose two accomplices, Gordon Hawkins, 23, and Mike Simeone, 33, were executed that very morning for complicity in a gang murder. The death of the pair and the especially prepared broadcast followed by one week the execution of their leader, the Duchess.
